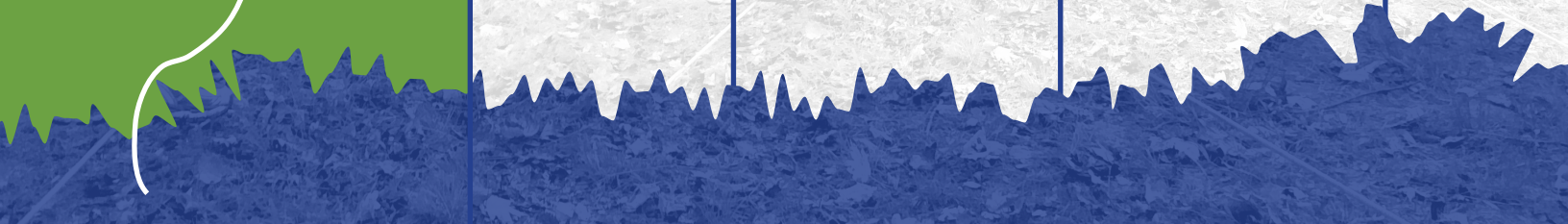
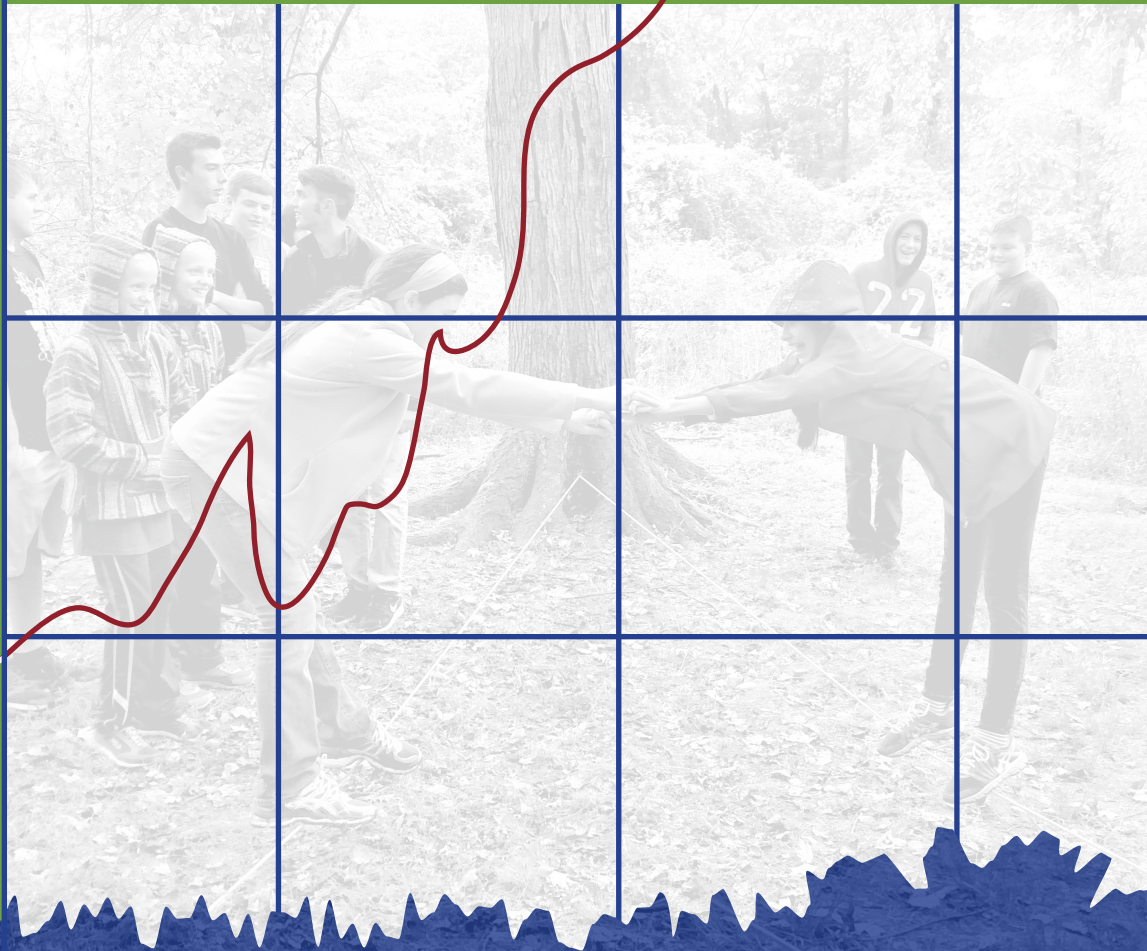

# THE FOUNDATION REPORT

## Dear Friends,

I remember after becoming a board member in 2003, I read a book written by Jack Schultz entitled *Boomtown USA, - 7 ½ Keys To Big Success In Small Towns*. The book provoked innovative thinking throughout rural America to spur out-of-the-box thinking. His writing intent was to motivate people to revitalize and reinvent their community into what he said separated the thinking towns from the struggling ones. A statement in that book has stayed with me over the years....he wrote: "The first thing any community should consider in their redevelopment plan is the implementation of a Community Foundation." How wonderful that Scott County had already completed this step in 1997 and the plan for our success and greatness had already begun.

In my time as a board member, it has been an honor to be involved with all the various programs, activities and funding that we have been able to provide to Scott County, with the support of many individuals and organizations. This past year continued to be a time of growth for the Scott County Community Foundation. With the ending of Lilly Endowment's GIFT IV matching grant campaign, we were able to bring \$830,000 to Scott County over the previous 18 months! We had several new funds established, which will have a large impact on the quality of life for our residents.

Our growth is not just measured in dollars. Our Youth Grantmaking Council is now teaching 65 students how to be young philanthropists, and they have shown great leadership and love for Scott County. Our partnership with United Way of Scott County to provide free books for children through the Dolly Parton Imagination Library has far surpassed the Dollywood Foundation projections. We are reaching several hundred children every month, and families share that they are reading more with their children as a result. We've supported numerous high school seniors and non-traditional adult learners with assistance for college. And we can't forget about the many other causes that were supported this year, such as historic preservation, beautification, health and self-sufficiency, animal care, youth programs and more.

When I first learned about foundations many years ago, I wondered what the effect of having something like that would have in my hometown. I've been able to see over the years exactly what that effect has been, and being a part of the Scott County Community Foundation is, no doubt, one of the most rewarding experiences that I have had.

While 2017 will be my last year of service on the Board of Directors, it has been my privilege to serve as Chairman and trustee of the community's donations. We take our fiduciary responsibility very seriously and you won't find a more professional and thoughtful Board of Directors than what you have at the Scott County Community Foundation. As we head into 2017 and commemorate our 20th anniversary, I hope you'll join us in celebrating.

# REASONS TO GIVE



## Types of Funds

**Designated:**

These funds are for a school, government agency, or specific 501(c)(3) charity selected by the donor, such as a museum or church.

**Donor Advised:**

These funds provide support to qualified charitable organizations or purposes with input from the donor and/or family/representatives.

**Scholarship Fund:**

These funds are for students to receive assistance for educational expenses. You may place restrictions on the scholarship, and the Foundation's scholarship committee selects the best candidate, with your advice if you so choose.

**Pass Through:**

A "charitable checking" account. A donor may recommend several organizations in which to receive funding. Funds are not invested in the market.

**Unrestricted:**

You place no restriction on how the fund is to be used, entrusting those decisions to the Board of Directors, now and generations to come.

**Field of Interest:**

These funds are for a general field selected by the donor, such as arts, education, healthcare, etc.

# EDUCATION INITIATIVES



Education Matters Southern Indiana (“EMSI”) is an initiative of the community foundations that serve Clark, Floyd, Harrison, Scott and Washington counties. Our goal is to increase the educational attainment of adults with some form of post-secondary education but no degree or certification. This represents about 40,000 people in our region (and about 2,850 in Scott County), and we continue to make progress since we first partnered several years ago to address this issue.

EMSI’s accomplishments for the past year include:

- Hired our executive director, Dr. Robert Johnson, to continue the work started by our first executive director. Robert has a Ph.D. in Higher Education Administration and 35 years of experience in higher education. EMSI also employed a part-time advisor to provide student advising, referrals and database management;
- EMSI has continued to engage employers to support their employees returning to college;
- We continue to identify adults with some college and no degree or certification. In Scott County, we are actively engaged with 13 of these students, several of whom have received thousands of dollars in scholarship assistance.

As we continue our efforts in 2017, we look forward to sharing many more success stories and increasing the number of adults who have completed a degree or certification.

## The Dolly Parton Imagination Library

This initiative in Scott County continues to show steady growth. It has been four full years since we partnered with United Way of Scott County to bring this program to our community. Over 24,000 free age-appropriate books have been mailed directly to children’s homes each month, helping to meet our goal of increasing early childhood literacy.

By the end of 2016, there were 791 children registered for the program, plus over 400 kids who “graduated” from the program when they turned five. Our community has been very supportive, and along with grants, we have received many donations from individuals, businesses and civic organizations to ensure this program will continue. Our Early Childhood Committee has also hosted literacy events to create awareness and promote literacy.

Lilly Scholars receive 4-year scholarships for tuition plus \$900 for books and required expenses. Jordan Shuler, a graduate of Scottsburg High School, is attending Grace College. He is majoring in accounting and sport management. The value of his scholarship is \$104,600. Lilly Endowment has awarded 35 scholarships through the Scott County Community Foundation since 1998.

“My first semester of college has exceeded every expectation I could have possibly had before it started. Right from the time I arrived at Grace College, I felt very welcome and a part of a very tight knit community.

I started to make close friends and most of

these friendships have deepened over my first semester and will continue to as my college career progresses. I have been given so many opportunities to succeed in each part of college life and I am so thankful for that. In my classes, each one of my professors take the time to know each of their students, and they would do anything to help us out. They care about me as both a student and a person.

So far, the academic side of college has not been too complex. I have been good about disciplining myself to get work done, which I did not do well in high school. Many of my academic weaknesses from high school have disappeared because of the way I have managed my time. I still do not devote a lot of time to studying at the moment, but this is going to change next semester with the amount of business classes I will be taking, as well as the more difficult freshman classes. 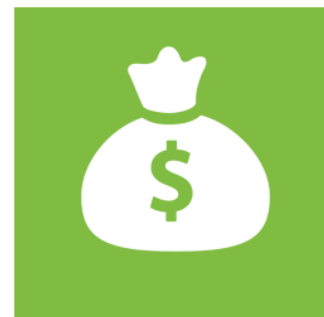
