### **Early Childhood Plan Presented to Community**

Did you know that for every dollar invested in high-quality early care and education, there is a return between \$4 and \$16? Did you know that nearly 70 percent of Scott County children of working parents are in unregistered care with no quality monitoring? Did you know that 90 percent of brain development occurs by age five? It is crucial for the Scott County community to have awareness on the critical issues of early childhood care and education, and to support efforts to solve the issues that arise from a child care shortage and lack of preschool education.

Our Early Childhood Committee finished work on creating an early care and education strategic plan, which was funded by a grant from Lilly Endowment, Inc. We contracted services with Dr. Melissa Fry with the Indiana University Southeast Applied Research and Education Center to craft the plan. Several listening sessions with multiple focus groups were hosted this spring. These included those who work in education, employers, elected officials, early childhood workers and directors, youth-serving organizations, and parents of young children. The goal of the plan is to provide action steps to ensure that every child in Scott County receives high-quality, safe, and developmentally appropriate care from birth to age five.

Results were presented to Austin City Council, Scottsburg City Council, Scott County School Districts 1 and 2 School Boards, Scott County Commissioners, Scott County Council, and a general

community meeting. There are three main components to the plan:

- 1. Community Education and Advocacy
- 2. Create a County Early Care and Education Director
- 3. Build High Quality Early Care and Education Workforce Pipeline
