Message from the Board Chair and Executive Director

Dear Friends of the Foundation,

2025 was truly a year for the books.

For many years, we envisioned launching a women's giving circle. This year, with the right timing and the right group of passionate leaders, that vision became reality through the creation of Scott County Women's Philanthropy. This new initiative is already strengthening connections and increasing the impact of women's generosity in our community.

We celebrated the installation of our fourth StoryWalk®, this time at the newly formed Spicertown Park in Austin — expanding literacy, outdoor activity, and family engagement in a creative and lasting way.

It was also a record-breaking year for grantmaking. More than \$418,000 in grants and scholarships were awarded to support nonprofits, students, and community initiatives throughout Scott County. In addition, 78 middle and high school students participated in our Youth Grantmaking Council, learning firsthand about leadership, service, and the power of giving back.

We continued investing in our nonprofit partners by offering educational sessions designed to strengthen organizational capacity and deepen knowledge across the sector. Several new funds were established this year, each creating a permanent source of support for the causes and students our donors care about most.

Our work to complete the Lilly Endowment GIFT VIII fundraising goal remained a priority, building unrestricted resources that allow us to respond to community needs while also supporting the Scott County Family YMCA's plans to renovate and construct a state-of-the-art daycare facility.

We were deeply honored to be named Partner of the Year by Leadership Southern Indiana, a meaningful recognition of the collaboration and partnerships that fuel our success.

None of this would be possible without you.

As a supporter of the Scott County Community Foundation, you are part of the solution. Your generosity drives opportunity, strengthens organizations, and builds a brighter future for our community. We are grateful to work alongside you and look forward to all we will accomplish together in the year ahead.

MICHELLE KORTY CUDDLE FUND

Passionate. Advocate. Committed. Dreamer. Supportive. Hard-working. Michelle Korty embodied all of these attributes and more. As the community's ultimate nurturer, Michelle was generous with her time and compassion towards others. After her untimely passing in October 2024, her friends and colleagues have honored her legacy through creating this unrestricted fund to help the community.



Michelle faced significant challenges as a child, which inspired her to create safe, happy, carefree childhoods for others. Her career serving her community started after she received her master's degree in social work from Spalding University.

Her work in Scott County spanned multiple organizations and collaborative efforts, to include the Center for Women and Families, Lifespring, New Hope Services, Worth the Wait, CEASe of Scott County, Get Healthy Scott County, Prevent Child Abuse, A Place to Be, and CRADLE Pregnancy Resource Center. She was a fierce advocate for Trauma Informed Care and for creating awareness about how Adverse Childhood Experiences affect people.

"I could always count on Michelle to be the positive force in a meeting," shared longtime colleague Dr. Shannon Mount. "She would always have the room dreaming about the next big thing – the future positives. Michelle taught me to embrace change gracefully and even look forward to the process."

"She moved our community beyond education on adverse childhood experiences to healthy outcomes from positive experiences," shared colleague Carissa Miller. "The services she provided to the community and the love and support she provided to those of us in social services created a community of compassion, warmth and support where no door is the wrong door and all people are seen as valuable individuals within our society. She always found ways to make everyone feel seen, heard and loved."

After she passed away, her colleagues wanted to honor the selfless and sacrificial nature of their dear friend who touched so many hearts with her unwavering kindness, empathy and deep care for others.

STAN AND SANDY STONER GOLF FUND FOR STUDENTS

A new endowment fund will support young golfers in their "A" Game thanks to the generosity of a local couple who has enjoyed the sport over the years. The Stan and Sandy Stoner Golf Fund for Students will provide support to Scott County School District 2's golf teams, with preference to those in financial need.



Stanley Stoner joined the Army National Guard after high school graduation, eventually becoming the company commander of the Seymour and North Vernon units. He served for 12 years. He then worked in the tire business for 20 years before taking a job at Scott Memorial Hospital, where he retired as Director of Building Services.

After high school graduation, Sandy attended the University of Louisville, where she earned her bachelor of science degree. She later attained her master's degree at Indiana University. She retired from Scott County School District 2 after teaching for 37 years.

After retirement, the couple purchased a home near the golf course and started golfing for enjoyment. "We thoroughly enjoyed the sport plus we had the opportunity to meet new people," shared Sandy. "It was interesting to watch students become involved in the schools' golf leagues and after graduation some enjoyed golfing in college."

The couple was always active in First Baptist Church until Stan passed away Dec. 21, 2016. Sandy remains an active member. Their son and three grandsons enjoy golfing after work and on the weekends, so golf has remained a passion for the family.

Because golf is an expensive sport, Sandy wanted to provide financial assistance for students so that it wouldn't be an obstacle to participation. She created an endowment fund at the Scott County Community Foundation to provide a permanent source of support for students at Scott County School District 2.

"Stan and Sandy Stoner are two incredible individuals," said Scottsburg High School Athletic Director Jamie Lowry. "Their generosity and support will have a long lasting impact on not only our golf program but also on our community!"

Programs & Initiatives

StoryWalk®

What do you get when you combine reading, exercise, and nature? You get a StoryWalk®! Storybook pages are displayed along a walking path, encouraging children and families to build early literacy skills while enjoying the outdoors. Books from the Dolly Parton Imagination Library and local authors are sponsored by local businesses and families, and titles are rotated quarterly to keep each visit fresh. In December 2024, we celebrated our fourth installation at Spicertown Community Park, made possible by a grant from Duke Energy Foundation. StoryWalk® locations now include: Austin Community Park, Manauh Memorial Park, Scott County Courthouse, and Spicertown Park.



Imagination Library

More than 12 years ago, we partnered with United Way of Scott County to bring Dolly Parton's Imagination Library to our community. The program is supported annually by Kiwanis Club of Scott County, Friends of the Library, and many generous community donors.

Last year, nearly 900 children were enrolled, receiving free, age-appropriate books mailed directly to their homes each month. Since 2013, almost 120,000 books have been delivered to Scott County children, and more than 2,500 children have "graduated" from the program at age five.

We are deeply grateful to the partners and donors who help place books - and opportunity - into the hands of our youngest learners.



Scott County Women's Philanthropy

This new initiative was created to foster connection and collective impact as women come together to champion causes that matter to them. Members gather quarterly to socialize, learn, and inspire one another - building both relationships and meaningful change.

Each \$100 annual membership is intentionally structured for impact: half is awarded back to the community through a member-selected grant, and half is invested in an endowment fund to grow future grantmaking.

Our first gatherings combined philanthropy with fun and fellowship. Members explored the art of cheese and charcuterie through a hands-on tasting and later learned to create beautiful floral bouquets. Each event intentionally supports a woman-owned small business, extending the circle of impact.

In our inaugural year, 57 women joined - a powerful statement that women believe in the difference they can make together.




Scott County Youth Grantmaking Council



Seventy-eight youth in grades 6-12 learned about giving their time, talent, and treasure back to the community this past year. Some of YGC's accomplishments included:

- Awarded \$4,596 in grants for 8 youth projects;
- Visited grant recipients to see firsthand the impact of their grantmaking;
- Participated in 31 community service projects;
- Raised \$752 at their Restaurant Night, Chillers and Papa John's fundraisers;
- Learned leadership skills through officer and chairperson positions, grant decision-making, community presentations, and interviews for new and current members. They represented Scott County at Leadership Southern Indiana's Scott County Day, sharing all about YGC.
- Grew closer through fun activities like Friendsgiving and paintball;
- Taught philanthropy to 4th and 5th graders at Johnson Elementary School.

Lilly Endowment Inc. has awarded 44 scholarships to Scott County students through the Community Foundation since 1998.





Assets by Fund Type




